What do you need to do?

Nothing more than enjoy the amazing food that is provided through your school.


Fuel for School work across the UK with many different providers to pick up edible surplus food and find ways for it to be used. We will receive a delivery of this surplus food every Thursday which will be made available to the school community through a market stall. The stall will be set up outside the main office and will open at the end of the school day every Thursday starting from Thursday 8 November 2018. Please ensure you bring your own carrier bag as these will not be available from school.

How much does the food cost?

We believe all food has value. We also believe that there are many different ways to value something aside from money and that different people value different things. For that reason, any food that we make available to you will be 'Pay As You Feel' (PAYF). Pay As You Feel means that we let you decide how you want to value the food we have provided. Whilst money is appreciated and will help provide funds for our school, we also welcome time and skills in return. Please ask about the various ways in which you might be able to help if you prefer to pay in kind.
