In PSHE we are learning to: Identify similarities and differences between people. Empathise with those who are different from them. Begin to appreciate the positive aspects of these differences.	Talk about different animals and how they are similar and different. Talk about favourite foods or TV shows and discuss if there is anything you both like and what is different. Our story this week is 'Pumpkin Soup'	Asking your child questions about the story.  Who are the characters?  Where is the story set?  How did the story end?	A video recording of the story  Click <u>here</u>	Retell the story using teddies or dolls to represent the characters.
The sounds we are learning this week are ay, ee, igh, ow, oo,	Write some words with the sounds in and help your child read them. Help your child to write some words with the sounds in.	Videos to introduce the sounds:  ay ee igh ow oo	Find items around the house with the sounds you have been learning in the word.
In Maths we are learning how to partition a number into two smaller numbers using the part-whole model.	Giving your child a number between 2 and 10 and some objects (Lego bricks, counters, pegs).  Ask the children to find all the ways they can make that number and write it down (e.g. 1 + 6 = 7, 2 + 5 = 7, 3 + 4 = 7 etc.)	Click <u>here</u> to watch some useful videos	Practise counting in 2s.
In English we are learning to sequence and retell the story of 'Pumpkin Soup'.  We are also learning about adjectives.	Draw pictures of the main events of the story and write a word or sentence to match the picture	Click <u>here</u> to help your child understand what an adjective is.	Find an object or toy and write some adjectives to describe it.
