- ★ What has happened in the book so far? Can you summarise the plot/text in ten words?
- ★ What do you think might happen next? What are the clues that make you think this?
- ★ Where is the story set? (For example: a forest, the seaside, a castle etc.)
- ★ Who are the characters in the story? Who do you like/dislike and why?
- ★ Pick out three of your favourite words or phrases from this section of the book. Can you explain why you chose them?

### Early Years and KS1: Look Up! by Nathan Bryon
