Science	Forces – Investigating the forces of friction, air resistance, water resistance and gravity.	Space – Investigating the solar system, the motion of the Earth, how we get day and night and facts about the Moon. PSHE	Me and My Relationships – A focus on managing friendships and the value of team work.	Valuing Differences – tolerance and respect for others, showing an understanding that it is ok to be different.
Art	Architectural observational drawings and printing – Investigating the built environment through drawing and printmaking. Sculpture and 3D – Introducing installation art as a medium for communicating a message.	
Music	Solar System - Listening and identifying structures of a piece of music.	At the Movies - Composing a piece of music to accompany a short clip
Geography	What is life like in the Alps? – The children will locate the Alps on a map, identify the countries that it runs through and learn about the human and physical characteristics.	
History	British History — What was life like in Tudor England? The children will learn about Henry VIII and his 6 wives using primary and secondary sources to make deductions.	
DT	Electrical systems - Doodlers Explore electric circuits and apply this knowledge to design and make their own electric doodler.	
French	French monster pets – Developing our French vocabulary for body parts and adjectives to describe colour, shape and size.	Space Exploration – Developing our French vocabulary to describe the solar system and compare planets.
Computing	iProgram - Children will develop their computational thinking and programming skills by creating animations using Scratch.	iDraw - Children will use a variety of programmes and software to create graphical drawings.
PE	Swimming (Redwood) Cricket/Rounders - striking and fielding	Swimming (Redwood) Dance - interpret and choreograph a routine
RE	Sikhism - Beliefs into action Our key question is: 'How far would a Sikh go for his/her religion?'	Christianity - Christmas Our key question: 'Is the Christmas story true?'
